



How to reach the Arogyadhatri Ayurveda research Institute?



Visakhapatnam, the city of Destiny

Visakhapatnam, also commonly known as Vizag, is one of the oldest port cities in the country. Situated in the heart of Andhra Pradesh, Visakhapatnam is known for its picturesque beaches and serene landscape, as well as a rich cultural past, which makes it an ideal spot for a fantastic coastal vacation. The port of Visakhapatnam is home to the oldest shipyard in all of India, and with a plethora of manmade wonders and natural spectacles, Visakhapatnam is a must-visit tourist destination in South India.







Araku Valley is a hill station and valley region very near to Vizag City. It's surrounded by the thick forests of the Eastern Ghats mountain range. The Tribal Museum is dedicated to the area's numerous indigenous tribes, known for their traditional Dhimsa dance, and showcases traditional handicrafts. A miniature train runs through Padmapuram Gardens, with its sculptures and tree-top huts. Katiki Falls originates from River Gosthani about 90 kilometres from Visakhapatnam. The waterfall is located near the Borra Caves and is a famous attraction for picnickers and nature lovers.



Borra Caves is one of the Largest and deepest Caves in India and at height of around 700 mtrs. Borra Caves were discovered by British geologist William King in 1807 with karstic limestone structures that are up to 80 metres deep. These caves are known for the breathtaking stalactite and stalagmite formations which are more than million years old. Located on the east coast of India, the Borra Caves are situated in the Ananthagiri hills of the Araku Valley in Visakhapatnam district. Breath taking hilly terrain, beautiful landscape, semi-evergreen moist deciduous forests, and wild fauna of the Borra Caves are a visual feast.



Kailasha Giri is a beautiful hilltop park perched at a height of 360 ft. sprawling over 100 acres of lush green land area, the park is perched on a hilltop and it offers scenic panoramic vistas of the surroundings and the beach below. The highlight of the place is the magnificent 40 feet statues of Shiva and Parvati painted in white. Among the attractions available, the best ones include Titanic Viewpoint, Floral Spot, Gliding Point, and Jungle Trails, Shanti Ashram, Shanku Chakra Nama and more. You can also reach here in a ropeway ride that is another major attraction. Bojjanna Konda, Totla Konda are Buddhist Monastaries dating back to 4th century AD. Yerada beach, Ramakrishna beach and Bheemili beaches are most popular beaches of Vishakapatnam, Kondakarla Ava is a famous Lake and Bird Sanctuary near Vizag



Submarine Museum is located in Visakhapatnam in the south-eastern state of India. The museum is inside an actual submarine, INS Kurusura, which was India's 5th submarine. The museum is situated on RK beach, near the War Memorial in Visakhapatnam. The INS Kurusura served the Indian Navy for 31 years before it was decommissioned in 2001. Post that, it was used as a museum to spread awareness about Indian Naval Forces, the technology used and its development in India. It is a one of a kind project that was launched by the Eastern Naval Command. The interiors of the submarine have been re-arranged to allow a clear view to the visitors. It is the only Submarine Museum in the entire of Asia.
